

Article 1 – Gun Laws and Licensing

In February, a mass shooting following a parade and rally celebrating the Kansas City Chiefs Superbowl win led to 1 person losing their life and at least 21 others injured. This was just the latest in seemingly a regular stream of horrific news stories that emanate from the US. Each time there are calls for changes to the gun laws in the US which are ingrained in America society through the 2nd amendment to the US constitution. In DC V Heller on June 26, 2008, the US Supreme Court explored the meaning of the 2nd amendment. They found that the amendment guarantees an individual the right to possess firearms regardless of whether they are part of the state militia and to use firearms for traditionally lawful purposes, including self-defence within the home.

What are your views on the US gun laws and do you think they need to be changed? Do you think a change could offer greater protection for US citizens, protection from incidents such as the one in February and many other previous incidents?

Article 2 – Amendment to the criminal justice bill

An amendment to the criminal justice bill is being made that will make it an offence for anyone to create a sexually explicit deepfake image. A deepfake image is an image or recording created which has been convincingly altered or manipulated to misrepresent someone. This is regardless of whether the intention is to share the image. An offence will be committed if there is an intention to cause alarm, humiliation, or distress to the individual. The change is being brought in due to the large increase in cases where the use of software, including AI enables a digital image or video to be altered. Faces of individuals can be replaced with someone else's for example. The rapid advance in technology does seem to

lead to governments and legislators constantly having to play catch up with changes to legislation to regulate a market, where maybe sometimes ethics are not a big enough part of decision making? As part of your apprenticeships at level 3 and level 4 you will learn or have learnt about the importance of understanding the environment when making decisions and how the environment has impacts on a business. Just think about your PESTEL or SWOT analysis. Is technology advancement too rapid?
